## Hillsborough focused on winning division tourney

Hillsborough 9-10-year-old All-Stars manager Jeff Cozad sees no reason why his club can't make a big splash at the Northern California Division Tournament, which begins Saturday in Rocklin. Hillsborough, Section 3 winner, takes on Section 1 winner Alameda at 10 a.m.

"My players aren't fully satisfied," Cozad said. "They're a focused group. Almost all of them have traveled to different tournaments, played a lot of baseball and are well-seasoned. They can handle the pressure. I think we can make a good run at it."

Other teams entered include Hollister American (Section 5), Woodcreek-Roseville (Section 4), River Park-Fresno (Section 6) and Peach Bowl-Yuba City (Section 2). Hollister American outscored its opponents 92-9 in winning the District 9 Tournament. Top two pitchers for Hollister American are Robert Soto and Austin Wahl.

"We have five or six pitchers who can throw,"

Hollister American manager Robert Fabing said. "We swing the bat from 1-through-13."

Hillsborough hit .400 overall in winning the district and section tournaments. Here is a breakdown of the Hillsborough 9-10s with comments on each player from Cozad (in probable batting order):

 Henry Caruso — OF/P/1B: "Henry's a great center fielder. He gets a great jump on the ball and has a strong arm. A good hitter."

Brock Cozad — SS/P: "Played tremendous shortstop during section and district. Had about 40 chances and only made one error in a pressure position. Understands the game."

 Grant Goodman — 3B/P: "Has great bat speed. Hits the ball to all fields. Good pop. Didn't pitch during the regular season, but has really progressed as a pitcher. He throws hard and has a good off-speed pitch."

 Austin Marcus — P/SS/3B: "He's as good a 10-year-old pitcher as I have ever seen. Total
